### BARNEY'S LOUNGE COFFESHOP

### DAM SQUARE

The city's epicentre. The National Monument, the Royal Palace, and the Nieuwe Kerk are located there.

### CANALS

They're everywhere. Some call Amsterdam the Venice of the North. Which is not strange, as it has more than 75 km in canals.



### RED-LIGHT DISTRICT

There's nothing to say about this emblematic district in the centre of the city.

### VAN GOGH MUSEUM

### OUDE KERK
