SKY ROOM

FIFTH AVENUE

The millionaires' avenue is also the most famous street in New York together with **Broadway**, the only diagonal street in Manhattan. CHRYSLER BUILDING



An amazing Art Deco building that was the highest in New York for 11 months, until it was surpassed in 1931 by the **Empire State**, which held the record until 1972.
